**CALL TO ORDER.**

Mayor Bassett called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

**I. APPROVAL OF AGENDA.**

**MOTION:** Councilor Abrams made a motion to approve the Agenda.  
Councilor Holle seconded the motion.

**VOTE:** All Councilors voted aye. The motion carried.

**II. RESOLUTION.**

**A. Resolution No. 2018-12. A RESOLUTION TO PROCLAIM EXTREME OR SEVERE DROUGHT CONDITIONS WITHIN THE TOWN OF EDGEWOOD AND TO BAN THE SALE AND USE OF CERTAIN FIREWORKS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN AND ITS WILDLANDS**

Mr. Juan Torres stated this resolution is to proclaim extreme or severe drought conditions within the town of Edgewood and to ban the sale and use of certain fireworks within the boundaries of the town and its wildlands. He stated the sale and use of missile-type rockets, helicopters, aerial spinners, stick-type rockets and ground audible devices are banned within the affected drought area, which includes all incorporated portions of the Town of Edgewood. He concluded by stating This resolution and Proclamation shall be effective for thirty (30) days from the date below, but may be reissued if extreme or severe drought conditions warrant. Further, this Resolution and Proclamation may be modified or rescinded within the thirty (30) days of their effectiveness if the Governing Body of the Town of Edgewood, after conducting an emergency hearing, determines that weather conditions have improved.

Councilor Abraham asked about a current ban in Bernalillo County that is banning the use of smoking in vehicles in or near the county park, campground, or any wildland area.

Mr. Torres stated this ban was created from the State Forestry Division, in which, they are able to impose more than a municipality.

Councilor Jaramillo had concerns of Smith's and Walmart being impacted with the sale of their fireworks.

Mr. Torres stated those fireworks are allowed, it is more of the big whole sales being impacted by the ban of certain fireworks.

**MOTION:** Councilor Abraham made a motion to approve the Resolution No. 2018-A Resolution to proclaim extreme or severe drought conditions within the town of Edgewood and to ban the sale and use of certain fireworks within the boundaries of the town and its wildlands.  
Councilor Holle seconded the motion.

**VOTE:** Councilor Holle voted aye. Councilor Jaramillo voted aye. Councilor Abrams voted aye. Councilor Abraham voted aye.  
The motion carried.

Mayor Bassett adjourned the meeting of June 29, 2018 10:06 a.m.


