FREE MEALS for Children Ages 1-18



Beginning March 16 and ending April 3, 2019, free nutritious meals will be provided to all children 1-18 years old who are present at the meal service locations. The meals served will be the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service.

All meal services will be *curbside pick-up*. Children (1-18) must be in the vehicle to receive a meal.

For the protection from spreading illnesses families may not get out at the site. Meals will be eaten off site.

Breakfast and Lunch may be picked up at the same time at the morning meal service.

In the case of heavy snow or rain, mobile sites will be cancelled and meals will be available at the schools for curbside pick-up.
