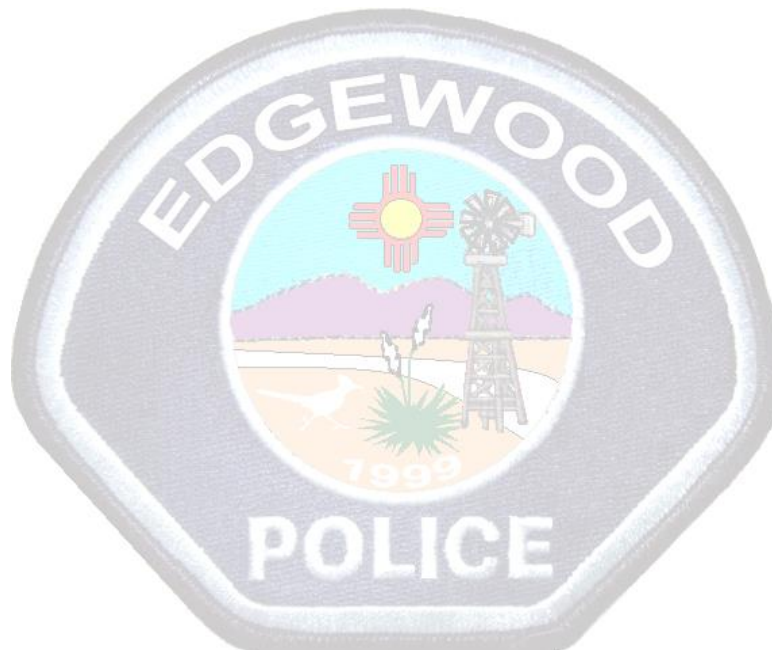

- 1) Animal Control Officer Mike Ring coordinated and worked long hours to make our first Town sponsored spay and neuter clinic a huge success. In total 70 companion animals were spayed or neutered locally. We look forward to bringing this event to the area a few times a year.
- 2) Volunteers are an important part of our mission here at the Police Department and Animal Control. EPD/AC held a volunteer appreciation day on April 6<sup>th</sup> to recognize the service these individuals provide the town of Edgewood.
- 3) Animal Control Volunteer Mollie DeFrancesco was unanimously voted in as the volunteer coordinator. Mollie has provided us with great service over the past year and we are looking forward to her input as we continue to move forward.
- 4) Town Easter Event was a huge success with on field counts around 1200 persons, making this the largest Easter event we have ever hosted.
- 5) All Edgewood Officers completed the NMLEA training on defensive tactics. All officers were brought through a hands-on physical training session to sharpen their skills. This type of training is necessary when relying on officers to protect this community and themselves in physical situations.



6) Edgewood Police had a successful sale of unclaimed property with a total value \$932.40

7) National Drug Take Back day was held on April 27<sup>th</sup>. The community cleared out their medicine cabinets and surrendered thousands of pills for proper disposal through the PD and DEA
