

**ELECTION RESOLUTION
TOWN OF EDGEWOOD
Resolution 1999-14**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF
EDGEWOOD:**

Section 1. PURPOSE, DATE OF ELECTION AND QUESTIONS TO BE SUBMITTED.

A special Municipal election shall be held on January 24, 2000, for the purpose of submitting the following questions to the qualified electors of the Town of Edgewood at the election :

- A) Shall the issuance of restaurant licenses for the sale of beer and wine be allowed within the local option district of the Town of Edgewood?*
- B) Shall inter-local transfers of liquor licenses be allowed into the local option district of the Town of Edgewood?*
- C) Shall Sunday sales of alcoholic beverages by the drink for consumption on the licensed premises of licensees be allowed in the local option district of the Town of Edgewood?*
- D) Shall the sale, service or consumption of beer and wine with meals on licensed premises from noon until 10:00 p.m. on Christmas day be allowed in the local option district of the Town of Edgewood?*
- E.) Shall the sales of alcoholic beverages in unbroken packages for consumption off the licensed premises on Sundays be allowed in the local option district of the Town of Edgewood?*

Section 2. METHOD OF CASTING VOTES. The casting of votes by qualified electors of the municipality on election day, January 24, 2000, shall be recorded on an electronic voting machine.

Section 3. CLOSING OF REGISTRATION BOOKS. Only qualified electors of the Town of Edgewood may vote on the questions to be submitted at the special election. A qualified elector is any person whose affidavit of voter registration has been filed by the Santa Fe County Clerk on or before the twenty-eighth (28th) day prior to the election, who is registered to vote in a general election precinct established by the Santa Fe Board of County Commissioners that is wholly or partly within the Town of Edgewood boundaries, and who is a resident of the

Town of Edgewood. Registration books for this election will be closed at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, December 27, 1999.

Section 4. LOCATION OF POLLING PLACE AND CONSOLIDATION OF

PRECINCTS. Precincts 18 and 73 & consolidated for the special election and all qualified electors in these consolidated precincts will vote at the Edgewood Community Center, located on the frontage road east of the Fire Station, in Edgewood, New Mexico.

Section 5. ABSENTEE VOTING. Any qualified elector of the Town of Edgewood shall obtain only his or her application for absentee ballot, only from the office of the Town Clerk. Absentee voting in person shall begin at Monday, December 27, 1999. All applications for an absentee ballot must be completed and accepted by the Town Clerk prior to 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 20, 2000. After 5:00 p.m. on January 20, 2000, all unused absentee ballots will be publicly destroyed by the Town Clerk. The Town Clerk will accept completed absentee ballots delivered by mail, or in person by the voter casting the absentee ballot until 7:00 p.m. on January 24, 2000.

Section 6. EARLY VOTING. Early voting will be conducted in the office of the Town Clerk during the regular hours and days of business, Monday through Wednesday. Early voting will begin at 8:00 a.m. on January 4, 2000, and will close at 5:00 p.m., on Friday January 21, 2000. After 5:00 p.m. on January 21, 2000, all unused early voting ballots will be publicly destroyed by the Town Clerk.
